MAJOR EMPIRES AND POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS

THE ISLAMIC CALIPHATES

THE RAPID EXPANSION OF ISLAMIC CALIPHATES MARKED A SIGNIFICANT POLITICAL TRANSFORMATION IN AP WORLD HISTORY CHAPTER 12. SEVERAL OTHER REGIONAL EMPIRES AND KINGDOMS FLOURISHED IN THIS PERIOD, INCLUDING THE TANG AND SONG DYNASTIES IN CHINA, THE DELHI SULTANATE IN INDIA, AND THE MALI EMPIRE IN WEST AFRICA. THESE STATES CONTRIBUTED TO THE POLITICAL DIVERSITY AND COMPLEXITY OF THE POSTCLASSICAL WORLD THROUGH THEIR UNIQUE GOVERNANCE STYLES, MILITARY CONQUESTS, AND CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENTS.

RELIGIOUS AND CULTURAL TRANSFORMATIONS

CHRISTIANITY AND THE BYZANTINE INFLUENCE

CHRISTIANITY CONTINUED TO EVOLVE DURING THIS PERIOD, ESPECIALLY WITHIN THE BYZANTINE EMPIRE AND WESTERN EUROPE. THE GREAT SCHISM OF 1054 CE FORMALIZED THE DIVISION BETWEEN EASTERN ORTHODOX AND ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCHES. TRANS-SAHARAN TRADE

ACROSS THE SAHARA DESERT, CAMEL CARAVANS TRANSPORTED GOLD, SALT, AND OTHER COMMODITIES BETWEEN WEST AFRICA AND THE MEDITERRANEAN WORLD. THE WEALTH GENERATED FROM THIS TRADE SUPPORTED POWERFUL WEST AFRICAN EMPIRES LIKE GHANA AND MALI AND PROMOTED THE SPREAD OF ISLAM THROUGH MERCHANT COMMUNITIES.

SOCIAL STRUCTURES AND DAILY LIFE

URBAN LIFE AND CULTURE

CITIES GREW AS CENTERS OF TRADE, ADMINISTRATION, AND CULTURE. URBAN RESIDENTS EXPERIENCED DIVERSE CULTURAL INFLUENCES AND PARTICIPATED IN RELIGIOUS FESTIVALS, MARKETS, AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS. LITERACY AND ARTISTIC EXPRESSION FLOURISHED IN MANY URBAN CENTERS, REFLECTING THE BLENDING OF TRADITIONS AND INNOVATIONS.
