UNDERSTANDING ACT WRITING SCORES

THE ACT WRITING TEST IS AN OPTIONAL SECTION OF THE ACT EXAM DESIGNED TO ASSESS A STUDENT'S WRITING SKILLS THROUGH AN ESSAY PROMPT. UNLIKE THE MULTIPLE-CHOICE SECTIONS, THE WRITING TEST IS SCORED SEPARATELY AND DOES NOT CONTRIBUTE TO THE COMPOSITE ACT SCORE. EACH ESSAY IS EVALUATED BY TWO INDEPENDENT GRADERS WHO ASSIGN SCORES IN FOUR DOMAINS: IDEAS AND ANALYSIS, DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT, ORGANIZATION, AND LANGUAGE USE AND CONVENTIONS. EACH DOMAIN IS SCORED ON A SCALE FROM 1 TO 6, AND THESE SCORES ARE THEN COMBINED TO PRODUCE A FINAL WRITING TEST SCORE.

HOWEVER, THE FINAL ACT WRITING SCORE IS REPORTED ON A SCALE THAT RANGES FROM 2 TO 12, REPRESENTING THE AVERAGE OF THE TWO GRADERS' SCORES. THIS SCORING METHOD DIFFERS SIGNIFICANTLY FROM THE 1 TO 36 SCALE USED FOR THE COMPOSITE ACT SCORE, WHICH CAN CONFUSE STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS WHEN TRYING TO ASSESS OVERALL PERFORMANCE. THEREFORE, UNDERSTANDING HOW TO CONVERT ACT WRITING SCORES TO THE 36 SCALE IS ESSENTIAL FOR ACCURATE EVALUATION AND COMPARISON.

COMPONENTS OF THE ACT WRITING SCORE

THE ACT WRITING SCORE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING COMPONENTS:

- **TWO INDEPENDENT GRADERS:** EACH ASSIGNS A SCORE FOR EACH OF THE FOUR DOMAINS.
- **FOUR DOMAIN SCORES:** RANGING FROM 1 TO 6 FOR IDEAS AND ANALYSIS, DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT, ORGANIZATION, AND LANGUAGE USE AND CONVENTIONS.
- **WRITING TEST SCORE:** THE AVERAGE OF THE TWO GRADERS' SCORES, REPORTED ON A 2 TO 12 SCALE.

KNOWING THESE COMPONENTS IS THE FIRST STEP IN UNDERSTANDING HOW TO CONVERT THE ACT WRITING SCORE TO THE 36 SCALE.

THE ACT WRITING SCORING RUBRIC

THE ACT WRITING SCORING RUBRIC DEFINES THE CRITERIA USED BY GRADERS TO EVALUATE STUDENT ESSAYS. EACH DOMAIN SCORE REFLECTS A SPECIFIC ASPECT OF WRITING PROFICIENCY. THE RUBRIC HELPS ENSURE CONSISTENCY AND FAIRNESS IN GRADING BY PROVIDING CLEAR STANDARDS.

DOMAINS EXPLAINED

EACH DOMAIN MEASURES A UNIQUE ELEMENT OF WRITING:

- **IDEAS AND ANALYSIS:** EVALUATES THE CLARITY, INSIGHT, AND RELEVANCE OF THE ESSAY'S CENTRAL IDEAS.
- **DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT:** ASSESSES THE USE OF EVIDENCE AND REASONING TO BACK UP CLAIMS.
- **ORGANIZATION:** CONSIDERS THE STRUCTURE AND LOGICAL FLOW OF THE ESSAY.

EACH DOMAIN IS SCORED FROM 1 (LOWEST) TO 6 (HIGHEST). TWO GRADERS INDEPENDENTLY SCORE EACH DOMAIN, AND THE SCORES ARE AVERAGED TO CREATE THE FINAL DOMAIN SCORE.

FROM DOMAIN SCORES TO FINAL WRITING SCORE

THE FINAL ACT WRITING SCORE IS CALCULATED BY AVERAGING THE FOUR DOMAIN SCORES FROM BOTH GRADERS, RESULTING IN A SCORE BETWEEN 2 AND 12. THIS FINAL SCORE REFLECTS AN OVERALL ASSESSMENT OF THE STUDENT'S ESSAY PERFORMANCE. HOWEVER, SINCE THIS SCORE DOES NOT FIT INTO THE 1-36 ACT COMPOSITE SCORE SCALE, IT REQUIRES CONVERSION FOR MEANINGFUL COMPARISON WITH OTHER ACT SCORES.

HOW TO CONVERT ACT WRITING SCORES TO THE 36 SCALE

CONVERTING ACT WRITING SCORES TO THE 36 SCALE INVOLVES UNDERSTANDING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE WRITING SCORE RANGE (2-12) AND THE COMPOSITE ACT SCORE RANGE (1-36). ALTHOUGH THE ACT HAS NOT OFFICIALLY PROVIDED A DIRECT CONVERSION CHART, APPROXIMATE METHODS HAVE BEEN DEVELOPED TO INTERPRET THE WRITING SCORE ON A COMPARABLE SCALE.

CONVERSION METHODOLOGY

ONE COMMON APPROACH TO CONVERTING ACT WRITING SCORES TO THE 36 SCALE IS TO USE A LINEAR CONVERSION FORMULA. THE WRITING SCORE (2 TO 12) IS MAPPED PROPORTIONALLY ONTO THE 1 TO 36 SCALE USING THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

1. SUBTRACT 2 FROM THE ACT WRITING SCORE TO NORMALIZE THE MINIMUM SCORE TO ZERO.
2. CALCULATE THE FRACTION OF THE MAXIMUM WRITING SCORE THIS REPRESENTS (WRITING SCORE MINUS 2 DIVIDED BY 10).
3. MULTIPLY THIS FRACTION BY 35 (SINCE THE 36 SCALE RANGES FROM 1 TO 36, I.E., 35 INCREMENTS).
4. ADD 1 TO SHIFT THE SCALE BACK TO START AT 1.

THIS FORMULA CAN BE EXPRESSED AS:

$$\text{CONVERTED SCORE} = ((\text{WRITING SCORE} - 2) / 10) \times 35 + 1$$

EXAMPLE CONVERSION

FOR AN ACT WRITING SCORE OF 8:

- STEP 1: $8 - 2 = 6$
- STEP 2: $6 / 10 = 0.6$
- STEP 3: $0.6 \times 35 = 21$
- STEP 4: $21 + 1 = 22$

THIS MEANS A WRITING SCORE OF 8 APPROXIMATELY CONVERTS TO A 22 ON THE 36 SCALE.

CONSIDERATIONS AND LIMITATIONS

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THIS LINEAR CONVERSION IS AN ESTIMATION AND DOES NOT REFLECT NUANCED DIFFERENCES IN WRITING QUALITY. THE ACT WRITING SCORE FOCUSES ON ESSAY SKILLS RATHER THAN OVERALL ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY, SO DIRECT COMPARISONS TO COMPOSITE SCORES SHOULD BE MADE CAUTIOUSLY. ADDITIONALLY, SOME COLLEGES MAY INTERPRET WRITING SCORES INDEPENDENTLY WITHOUT CONVERSION.
