CORE BELIEFS AND PHILOSOPHICAL FOUNDATIONS

HINDUISM'S PLURALISTIC PHILOSOPHY

BUDDHIST TEACHINGS AND THE FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS

BUDDHISM CENTERS ON THE FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS, WHICH DIAGNOSE THE HUMAN CONDITION AS SUFFERING CAUSED BY DESIRE AND IGNORANCE, AND PRESCRIBE THE EIGHTFOLD PATH AS A MEANS TO LIBERATION. IT DENIES THE EXISTENCE OF A PERMANENT SELF (ANATTA) AND EMPHASIZES IMPERMANENCE (ANICCA) AND CONDITIONED EXISTENCE (DEPENDENT ORIGINATION). BUDDHIST PHILOSOPHY ENCOURAGES MINDFULNESS, COMPASSION, AND ETHICAL CONDUCT AS ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS OF THE SPIRITUAL PATH.

PRACTICES AND RITUALS

RITUALS AND WORSHIP IN HINDUISM

HINDU PRACTICES ARE DIVERSE AND INCLUDE TEMPLE WORSHIP (PUJA), RECITATION OF SCRIPTURES, MEDITATION, AND PARTICIPATION IN FESTIVALS. RITUALS OFTEN INVOLVE OFFERINGS TO DEITIES, CHANTING OF MANTRAS, AND OBSERVANCE OF RITES OF PASSAGE. REBIRTH IS SEEN AS A CONTINUATION OF A STREAM OF CONSCIOUSNESS INFLUENCED BY KARMA, RATHER THAN TRANSMIGRATION OF AN UNCHANGING SELF. DHARMA IN BUDDHISM PRIMARILY REFERS TO THE TEACHINGS OF THE BUDDHA AND THE ETHICAL PATH PRESCRIBED TO END SUFFERING.

ULTIMATE GOALS AND SPIRITUAL LIBERATION

MOKSHA IN HINDUISM

THE ULTIMATE GOAL IN HINDUISM IS MOKSHA, OR LIBERATION FROM THE CYCLE OF BIRTH, DEATH, AND REBIRTH (SAMSAARA). MOKSHA IS ACHIEVED THROUGH SELF-REALIZATION, DEVOTION, KNOWLEDGE, OR DISCIPLINED PRACTICE, DEPENDING ON THE CHOSEN SPIRITUAL PATH. LIBERATION RESULTS IN UNION WITH BRAHMAN AND FREEDOM FROM WORLDLY SUFFERING AND IGNORANCE.

NIRVANA IN BUDDHISM

IN BUDDHISM, THE HIGHEST AIM IS ATTAINING NIRVANA, A STATE OF COMPLETE CESSATION OF SUFFERING AND RELEASE FROM SAMSAARA. NIRVANA IS CHARACTERIZED BY THE EXTINCTION OF DESIRE, HATRED, AND DELUSION, LEADING TO PROFOUND PEACE AND FREEDOM. UNLIKE MOKSHA, NIRVANA IS NOT UNION WITH A UNIVERSAL SOUL BUT THE REALIZATION OF THE TRUE NATURE OF EXISTENCE.

KEY DIFFERENCES AND DISTINCTIVE FEATURES
