EXAMINING THESE HISTORICAL WAVES SHEDS LIGHT ON THE PATTERNS AND CYCLES OF IMMIGRATION THAT CONTINUE TODAY.

MAJOR IMMIGRATION WAVES

SEVERAL NOTABLE IMMIGRATION WAVES HAVE DEFINED DIFFERENT ERAS, EACH CHARACTERIZED BY UNIQUE PUSH AND PULL FACTORS. IMPACTS ON HOST COUNTRIES AND IMMIGRANTS
