CHARACTERISTICS OF A GOOD RESEARCH QUESTION

RELEVANCE AND SIGNIFICANCE

SPECIFICITY AND FOCUS

GENERAL OR OVERLY BROAD QUESTIONS CAN HINDER RESEARCH PROGRESS. A GOOD RESEARCH QUESTION IS SPECIFIC ENOUGH TO BE ANSWERABLE AND FOCUSED ON A PARTICULAR ASPECT OF A SOCIAL PHENOMENON. SPECIFICITY HELPS IN SELECTING APPROPRIATE METHODS AND FRAMING HYPOTHESES OR PROPOSITIONS.

OPEN-ENDEDNESS AND ANALYTICAL DEPTH

SOCIAL SCIENCE QUESTIONS TYPICALLY ENCOURAGE EXPLORATION AND ANALYSIS RATHER THAN SIMPLE YES/NO ANSWERS. THEY OFTEN BEGIN WITH WORDS LIKE "HOW," "WHY," OR "WHAT" TO PROMOTE CRITICAL THINKING AND COMPREHENSIVE INVESTIGATION. OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS ALLOW FOR DETAILED EXAMINATION OF UNDERLYING CAUSES, EFFECTS, AND RELATIONSHIPS.

STEPS TO FORMULATE A RESEARCH QUESTION IN SOCIAL SCIENCES

DEVELOPING A RESEARCH QUESTION BASED ON A SOCIAL SCIENCE PERSPECTIVE INVOLVES SEVERAL SYSTEMATIC STEPS THAT GUIDE THE TRANSITION FROM BROAD TOPICS TO FOCUSED INQUIRIES.

5. FORMULATE THE RESEARCH QUESTION

LACK OF FEASIBILITY

SOME QUESTIONS MAY NOT BE PRACTICAL DUE TO LIMITED RESOURCES, ACCESS TO DATA, OR ETHICAL CONCERNS. CONDUCTING A FEASIBILITY ASSESSMENT EARLY AND CONSIDERING ALTERNATIVE APPROACHES OR NARROWER QUESTIONS CAN HELP MITIGATE THIS ISSUE.

INSUFFICIENT THEORETICAL GROUNDING

WITHOUT A SOLID THEORETICAL FOUNDATION, RESEARCH QUESTIONS MAY LACK DIRECTION OR RELEVANCE. ENGAGING DEEPLY WITH RELEVANT LITERATURE AND THEORIES ENSURES THAT QUESTIONS ARE GROUNDED IN EXISTING SCHOLARLY WORK.

BIAS AND ASSUMPTIONS

RESEARCH QUESTIONS SHOULD AVOID EMBEDDED BIASES OR UNFOUNDED ASSUMPTIONS. CRITICAL REFLECTION ON LANGUAGE AND CONCEPTUAL FRAMING HELPS PRODUCE NEUTRAL AND OBJECTIVE QUESTIONS THAT PROMOTE VALID FINDINGS.

DIFFICULTY IN OPERATIONALIZING CONCEPTS
